When does school start?

What skills can we work on at home to help my child succeed in Kindergarten?

• In Kindergarten we talk a lot about *independence*.



- Students should be able to get ready by themselves.
- Practice zippers and buttons on pants and coats.
- Put their mittens on.
- Identify their own shoes
- Sit down to put on shoes (Velcro) and boots.
- Use the bathroom & wash hands
- As many students will be staying for lunch, it is important that they can open lunch containers, put lunch bags into back packs and clean up their spot.

What skills can we work on at home to help my child succeed in Kindergarten?

- In Kindergarten, we teach the ABC's and 123's
- To ensure your child's will ease into Kindergarten refer to the front of your folder for the readiness skills we hope students will arrive to school with.



- Read to your kids every night.
- Play with letters and sounds.
- Get them familiar with holding books and enjoying them.
- Teach them proper pencil grip
- Teach them how to print and recognize the letters in their name.
- Count to 10.
- Organize and separate house hold items and toys into groups.
- French Immersion Families should use Duolingo to teach basic words like: Hello, Goodbye, School, Please & Thank-you.

If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 school days, and Student C will have read for 3.

What skills can we work on at home to help my child succeed in Kindergarten?

• In Kindergarten we work to improve *motor movement*.



- Comfortably hold a pencil.
- Practice cutting.
- Sitting cross legged on the carpet with a book.
- Hopping, skipping, running, jumping.
- Find a play structure and climb it!

What skills can we work on at home to help my child succeed in Kindergarten?

• In Kindergarten we teach responsibility and empathy.



- It is important that our students respect and support others.
- Teach your child to share and take turns.
- Work on using words to apologize.
- Build your child's confidence that they are ready for school. (even if you are not ready to send them ☺)
- Teach your child how to ask for help and how use words to solve problems.

Experiences That Can Strengthen Your Child's Development

Children begin to develop critical learning skills at a young age that will help them be successful later in life; therefore, it is important for parents to provide opportunities for their children to work on these skills throughout early childhood. Learning opportunities will prepare children with the foundation necessary for success at school. Below are some simple ideas that will promote the development of skills included in the five EYE-TA domains.

A) Awareness of Self and Environment

 Dress for Success: Ask your child to select their clothing and dress themselves with minimal help. Discuss what they picked and whether or not it is an appropriate choice for the weather and occasion.





- Emotions Song: "If you're happy and you know it clap your hands (clap, clap) x 2 etc." Add other verses using appropriate actions and expressions (e.g., mad/stomp; surprised/jump; scared/hide).
- Find Teddy: To work on your child's concept of positions (e.g., front/back; top/bottom; over/under), place his or her teddy bear in different locations and ask your child to describe where Teddy is.



B) Cognitive Skills

 Cheerio Math: During snack time ask your child to count his or her food items. For example, ask your child to make groups or sets using Cheerios - demonstrate how to do this first if necessary.





- 2) Alphabet Song: Sing the alphabet regularly with your child. Once he or she has mastere all the letter names, match the names with the written letter and introduce the sounds that these letters make.
- 3) Storybook Reading: Read with your child early and often. Ensure that your child is engaged throughout the story by drawing his or her attention to the book and asking questions.


- A Police Information Check costs \$10
